

Bee Happy Sew Along -- Week 5 **Flower Pot Blocks, Peach & Pear, Thermos**  
 (Start of of **Section Three** Blocks) **ALL PATTERNS & PHOTOS BY LORI HOLT**



Cut Three Backgrounds: 4 1/2" x 8 1/2" (no trimming afterwards)

Flower Pot	Flower	Stems/Leaves
D8 Base <u>Lip of Pot (cut 3):</u> 7/8" run through 1/2" bias tape maker. Cut 4" long.	D13 Flower (cut 3) D1 Centers (Cut 3--use Karen Buckley technique for small circles) <u>Stems:</u> 5/8" run through 1/4" (9mm) bias tape maker, cut to 3" length. Make 3	D5 Leaves <u>Stems:</u> 1-7/8" x 9" run through 1" bias tape maker. <u>Cut Six Leaves</u> Some are embroidered, some are not.

### Placement and Steps:

1. Press block in half lengthwise to help in centering pieces.
2. Base of flower pot is 1" up from lower raw edge.
3. Flower is 1" down from upper raw edge.

## Peach and Pear



Cut two backgrounds 5" square...which will be trimmed to 4 1/2" square.

Peach	Pear	Stems/Leaves
D2 Circle	D16 egg shape	D15 Leaves <u>Stems:</u> 5/8" run through 1/4" bias tape maker. <u>Cut Two Leaves</u> which are embroidered.

Placement: bottom of fruit is 1" above raw edge of block.

After applying blocks, trim to 4 1/2"

### Thermos Block

**Alternatively:** I think I'm going to do a three-chicken block, found on next week's tutorial. She has us doing a *two-chicken*, but it wouldn't be hard to just make another. I'd be placing them on a piece of fabric 6" by 20 1/2" to match the bunting block's length (also next week's tutorial).

## A pair of Thermos jugs



Cut background square 7 1/2" by 6".

Thermos Body	Thermos Lid	Thermos bottom	Thermos Handle
2" by 3 1/2"	rectangle 1 3/4" by 2"	rectangle 1 " by 2"	1 1/4" x 10" strip, run through 3/4" bias maker

Cut piece of freezer paper 1 1/2" by 4 1/2"

Place shiny side up on constructed Thermos. Iron edges onto shiny side of freezer paper; appliqué to fabric background.



Placement is 3/4" up from the bottom and 3/4" down from the top, and 1 inch apart, centered.

Press a 1 1/2" long handle piece in half. Tuck raw edges under the top of the Thermos lid, as shown in top photo.




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My alternate: Cut a background piece 7 1/2" wide by 6" tall.  
Make a 7-hexie flower using 1" hexies. Applique to background.
