Placement and Steps:

- 1. Press block in half lengthwise to help in arranging pieces. Near as I can tell, she placed the tip of the tulip 3/4" down from top, and the base of the flower box 3/4" up from the bottom.
- 2. She cut the top strip of the flower box 1/2" wider on each side, tucked in the raw edges and pinned it down.
- 3. Insert the flower stem before stitching the flower box; see boxes above for stem lengths (all three are different).
- 2. Appliqué the pieces, complete the embroidery around centers of flowers.

- 1. Do not add a 1/4 or turn under on the bottom of D-32 beehive and D-22 door. Center onto background, aligning lower raw edges with edge of block.
- 2. Place the flowers 3/4" in from the top and sides of background block.



3. Place bottom of stem 1" in from edge of the beehive (*upper right photo*).
