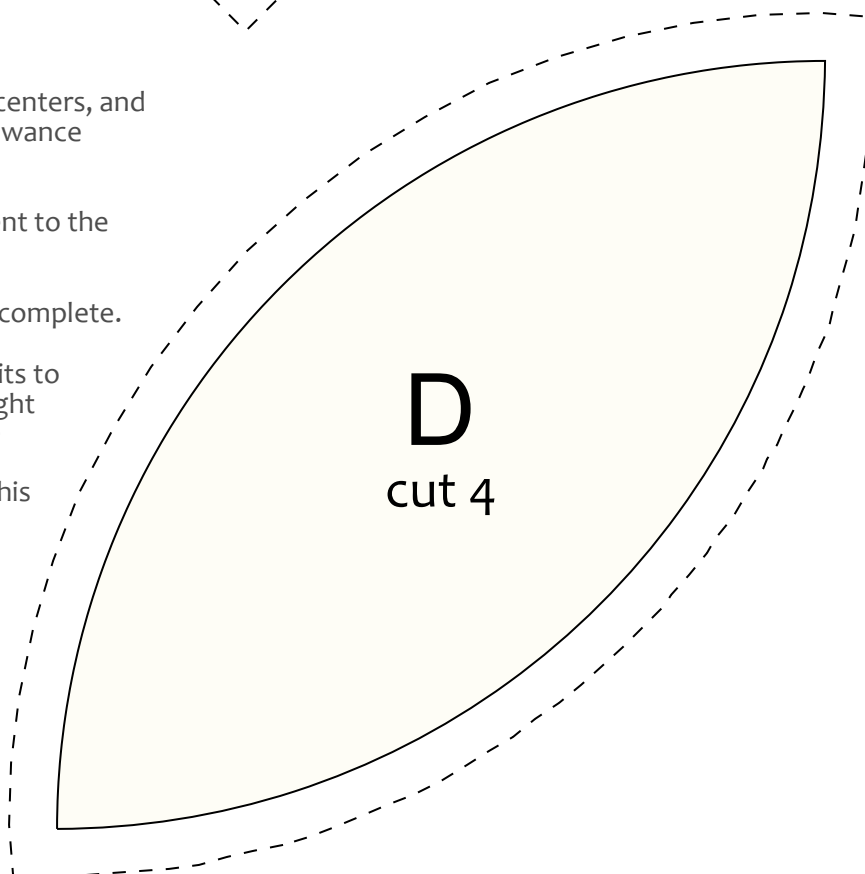
Circle on Circle



1. Make center 9-patch.
2. Sew on one Oval D, matching centers, and easing curves. Press seam allowance away from center.
3. Sew on another Oval D, adjacent to the first. Repeat pressing.
4. Continue on until first block is complete.

To make a quilt, join nine-patch units to needed ovals, working in straight lines, and keeping track where you'll need to sew on an oval. You know I'm sort of making this up, but I'm sure you've figure out this is probably not the quilt you'll make in a weekend. You'll have to pay attention, for sure.

I'm guessing the original maker did it by hand, and that is probably easier... but with some concentration, it could be done on the sewing machine.
